We expect enthusiastic teaching in the Bachelor and Master degrees (4 hours per week during the academic term). Successful candidates will be given the opportunity to do a habilitation (professorial qualification in the German academic system).

Successful applicants for 50% part-time positions are expected to have a good Diploma or Masters degree in Psychology, intention to complete a PhD (where not obtained already), scientific enthusiasm, and a specific interest in the research topics of the Department. We expect active teaching in either the Bachelor or Master degrees (2 hours per week during the academic term).

We offer work in an exciting team of researchers at the Department and in an interdisciplinary research network which investigates cognitive, social and neuronal processes involved in person perception and human interaction. The department hosts state-of-the-art labs (3 high-resolution EEG-labs with up to 144 channels, a 3D-camera system, an audio-video lab for recording and editing experimental stimuli, an eyetracking-lab, and the additional option to perform fMRI, TMS and MEG experiments in collaboration with other departments).
